#### TechTalk

### Flexible LED Interior Lighting

Recently while Paula and I were looking at lighting fixtures for the new house at Home Depot I happened across some LED tape strings. The white light was warm and bright unlike the cold blue-ish light emitted by many "white" LEDs. They certainly have improved the technology in the past year alone.

The under-cupboard lights in our existing home needed improvement to help sell it, so I bought a package. The lighting is a water-proof tape about 1/2" wide and 5 metres (that's about 16 feet) along with a peel and stick backing. Every 4" there are markings where you can cut the tape and make power connections. I cut appropriate lengths to fit and stuck them under our cupboards. I must say it looks really nice.

So... of course the GMC came to mind next. The LED tape runs directly off 12 volts DC and is much more efficient than incandescent or fluorescent. I measured the current for a 6 foot long string at 13.8 volts is 1.0Amps. Being flexible, cutable and peel 'n-stick means you can install it just about anywhere.

I tested a portion using a variable voltage power supply to simulate various voltages as would be experienced in the GMC. The brightness dimmed a bit from 14 down to 11.5volts but it was still quite bright at the lower voltage. The warm light colour did not change.

Mine came as a kit with a 120vac to 12vdc power supply, (which is not really needed in the GMC) for \$99.95 at Home Depot. I have found the same tape lighting on the Internet \$15.00US for a 5 metre roll without the power supply. This will be one of my first projects as soon as the snow melts!
