Tech Talk

House Batteries

For years the deep-cycle lead-acid (LA) battery has been about the only choice for the house battery, but it had some serious draw-backs.

- -Continuous maintenance (water levels, terminal corrosion etc)
- -You could only get about 50% of its available charge (below that you seriously reduce the life of the battery)
- -Explosive hydrogen gas is vented during charge and discharge.
- -The battery needs to be recharged immediately after discharging to prevent damage
- -LA batteries are very heavy
- -High self discharge rate (need to be kept on a float charge otherwise they die on their own)
- -A low charged LS battery will freeze in the winter and is damaged.
- -Use a low recharge rate (10 amps max) if you want maximum life.

There have been some improvements on the wet-cell, with gel-cell batteries requiring no maintenance, but the other limitations still existed.

Recently though Lithium battery technology has been gaining ground. At this point, depending on your needs, the more expensive Lithium Iron Phosphate (LiFePo4) battery is becoming a much better choice. Yes they are much more expensive, but with their increased life and other advantages they are more economical in the long run.



Some Pros and cons of LiFePo4 are: Pros:

- -Virtually maintenance free (sealed, no maintenance or terminal corrosion issues)
- -80-90% depth of discharge. From a 100 Amp-hr battery you can use 80-90 Amp-hr
- -Battery can be left in a partial discharge without damage and does not need to be recharged to the full 100%. It's still happy if you only recharge it to say 90%.
- -Faster recharge rate (can be recharged in about 3 hours)
- -Nearly flat voltage curve during discharge.
- -Much less weight. A 100 Amp-hr LiFePo4 battery weights about 35lbs vs 70-80lbs for LA. But for LA you would need about 200 Amp-hr (about the same as two 6V golf cart batteries) @140lbs to get the same

capacity as one 100 Amp-hr LiFePo4 battery.

- -Very low self-discharge, about 1-2% per month vs 15-20% for LA
- -Long life, 1500-2500+ recharge cycles vs 200-400 for lead acid (if not discharged below 50%)
- -LiFePo4 is a very safe battery technology. It can be installed inside the coach.

Cons:

- -High cost, around \$800USD for a 100 Amp-hr LiFePo4 battery
- -You will likely need to replace your converter/charger with one rated for LiFePo4.
- -You will need an alternator charging module to charge from the engine alternator.
- -Cannot be recharged if the battery temperature is below freezing.

So you can see that one 35lb LiFePo4 battery can easily outlast 4 sets of 140lb LA golf cart batteries... it may be the last battery you need to buy.

If you need to buy a new converter, you should look into purchasing one that already has the LiFePo4 charging capabilities so you won't need to replace it in the future if/when you change to Lithium batteries.
