Tech Article

Airbag Shut-off Valves.

One upgrade that everyone should have on their rear suspension is shut-off and Schrader valves on the airbags. Fourbag systems typically come with these mounted to the wheel-well air distribution blocks, so here we are talking about an upgrade to the OEM single bag per side systems.

The rear air suspension system has numerous points of failure which can cause loss of air or failure to get air into the airbag(s). These include the air-lines and their connectors, air compressor, ride height valves and solenoids. When a failure occurs, you need a way to isolate the fault and get air into the airbag itself.

An easy way to isolate the airbag is with a shut-off valve on each airbag. The shut-off valve simply provides a way to "shut-off" the air from leaving the airbag. If you have a leak in the system, simply pump up the airbag to the desired height and then turn the shut-off valve to the closed position. This will hold the air in the bag.

A Schrader Valve is a tire fill valve except you need the type in the form of a brass fitting. If you can't use the on-board compressor to pump up the airbag, the Schrader valve allows you to use an external tire compressor or other compressed air source to fill the airbag. Simply turn the shut-off valve to the closed position and use the external compressed air source to pump up the airbag to the desired height.

GMC Vendors have kits available, or you can buy the individual parts at local industrial / hydraulic supply shop.

One issue has been noted by long-time owners on the GMC Forums. The rear suspension experiences a lot of movement with road bumps and shock which can lead to fatigue and breakage of brass fittings. Therefore, it is recommended that you use steel fittings (T's and angle fittings) and keep the weight of the shut-off valve to a minimum.

While the airbag itself is very reliable however it is a good idea to carry a replacement airbag. A 13.5" 4x4 wood spacer with a lag bolt on each end, or a 3/4" by 18" threaded rod with 4 nuts and washers can also be substituted for the airbag for short term use.
